
b. display screen

Type I WISCOM Radio

TURNING ON THE RADIO

- **1** Make sure the radio is plugged into a working electrical outlet.
- **2** Make sure the **red switch (a)** on the lower left of the radio is lit. If not, flip it.
- **3** If the radio is on, the display screen **(b)** will be lit, showing letters and numbers (see photo, right).



5 The right side of the display screen **(b)** shows two numbers. To speak to hospitals in your region, these numbers should be 1, 1.

TALKING ON THE RADIO

- **6** To start communicating with another hospital, press and hold down the button with the lightning bolt on the base of the microphone **(d)**. You must continue to hold down the button while speaking.
- When you hear a beep, you can start talking.

 Note: If you do not hear a beep, take your finger off the microphone button. Use the volume knob (c) to adjust the loudness of the speaker (e). Try step 6 again.

If you hear a "bonk" instead, that means that you have been disconnected. Re-try the system after a few minutes, or contact your healthcare coalition coordinator for assistance.

State both the name of your facility and the facility/facilities you are talking to.

Example: "This is County Memorial Hospital in Greenburg, calling Region 8 hospitals."

- 9 To hear responses, take your finger off the lightning bolt button.
- **10** Using the volume knob **(c)**, adjust the loudness of the speaker **(e)**, if needed.
- **11** Repeat steps 6-9 to communicate with other hospitals.



- **12** To turn off the display screen, push in the center of the volume control knob **(c)**.
- **13** Finally, flip the switch on the lower left of the radio so that the light turns off.
