EMTrack System Overview	Presentation by Katherine Johnson and Jenn Behnke <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • EMTrack System is a tracking system of patient from field/on scene through their final disposition at the healthcare facility via a platform through Javare • It is real time awareness • Can be used for planned and unplanned events • EMResource and EMTrack talk to each other, hospitals will get alerted in real time that a patient is on their way to their hospital • Were able to use EMTrack through Operation Allies – tracked people from base to hospital and back to base 	

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• While designed for a mass casualty event, there are opportunities to use this platform during normal EMS runs – good practice to do so• MCI and Family Reunification Demo – see recording of this demo for details<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ EMTrack has mobile forms that are broken down to triage, treatment, and transport○ Need to have a phone or tablet with cellular data or wi-fi available to enter data○ You do not need service to use app and enter data, once you reach area of service, then data is all transferred○ Primary complaints are pre-populated for quick entry○ Can change primary complaints and status of patient (red, yellow...)○ You can enter ETA in the app○ Can add photos○ You still can provide a tracking number for unidentified patients – hospital needs to add more identifying info later○ Want to enter and track walk-in patients as well○ Need a barcode reader if you want to scan driver’s license, or use Juvare mobile app to scan○ 90% of reunification features need to be done in PC browser (not mobile app)○ Identifying information is critical to reunification○ For more info: https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/preparedness/systems/emtrack.htm	
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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ System can autogenerate a tracking number for day to day use so you don't need to burn through your tracking tags

Crisis Standards of Care Concept of Operations Overview</p>	<p>Presentation by Doug Hill: Crisis Standards of Care (CSC)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Seek community and provider engagement ● Adhere to ethical norms with strong ethical grounding ● Seek necessary legal protections for healthcare practitioners ● When to use CSC: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Extreme crisis – hurricane pandemic earthquake, bioterrorism ● Scarce medical resources – blood, ventilators, drugs, vaccines, staff ● CSC can occur: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Small scale – bus crash, tornado, multiple shootings, etc. ○ Large scale natural disasters – hurricanes, large scale flooding ○ Complex mass casualty events – large scale shootings, chemical or radiological incidents, limited outbreaks of lethal and contagious infectious diseases (Ebola) ● Implementing CSC is a forced choice based on the emerging situation ● Recommendations to OPEHC: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ State Disaster Medical Advisory Committee ○ Master Mutual-Aid Agreement or MOU ○ Education on Legal and Ethical Decision Making <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ What you can do vs. what you can't do ● Draft of CSC Concept of Operations has been developed – who, what, where, why, why of CSC ● 2010 Hospital Guide to Mass Casualty Incidents
