

Mass Causalty Incident October 2023

Carberry, Canada

- June 16, 2023 Carberry 2 hours West of Winnipeg, Canada
- Just after noon on a Thursday
- A bus carrying elderly people to a casino crashed on the Trans-Canada Highway
- Bus collided with a semi-trailer truck at a highway intersection
- Bus was crossing the eastbound lanes when it was struck by the truck that was going east (the semi had the right of way)
- 15 people were killed (with one person later dying), and at least 10 people were taken to the hospital those in hospital had "significant injuries" due to the force of the crash (bus was carrying a total of 25 people)
- Royal Canadian Mounty Police reported that all of its resources, including its major crimes unit were deployed to the scene
- 12 ambulances and an air ambulance were dispatched
- Was one of the largest responses ever to a crash in that area
- Medical Examiner worked with families to identify victims significant injuries suffered by those who died, made it difficult to identify them
- A Family Support Center was opened in Dauphin, and then a second location was opened in Winnipeg to meet demand

Impacts:

- Rural setting
- Number of patients needing transport, multiple hospitals needed
- Severity of patients
- Need for family assistance center
- Need for activation of mass fatality plan

Preparedness:

- Consider using Disaster Available Supplies in Hospital (<u>DASH</u>) tool for pre-planning
 - o This tool helps you plan for number of supplies you may need for an MCI event
