

Snow Storm Event November 2023

Erie County, New York

- November 18-21, 2014 Erie County, NY received unprecedented snowfall; some areas received 60-84 inches of snow
- The rapid accumulation resulted in stranded drivers, travel bans, and logistical challenges with snow removal
- Sporadic power outages affected some households
- Eleven deaths were linked to snow storm, one death was directly related, nine were indirectly related, and one possibly storm related
- To determine storm-related mortality, the Medical Examiner's Office worked with law enforcement, hospitals, urgent care centers, first responders, funeral homes, and nursing homes to investigate and classify reports
- Decedents ranged in age from 30-92, with a mean age of 64
- Cause of deaths include:
 - 1 Hypothermia
 - 4 shoveling/blowing snow
 - o 2 carbon monoxide intoxication deaths occurring in stranded vehicles
 - 2 acute medical emergencies that could not be transported to facilities with appropriate levels of care
 - 1 trying to free a stuck vehicle
 - o 1 emergency relocation of a nursing home resident, resulting in death
- Most of the deaths that occurred were potentially preventable

Impacts:

- Increase in motor vehicle crashes and cardiac events
- Road closures or undrivable roads impacts staffs' ability to arrive for shifts
- Potential for loss of power for facilities and homes
- Vulnerable populations at higher risk especially those isolated or dependent on power (i.e., oxygen)

Preparedness:

- Reinforce public health messaging, with specific emphasis on vulnerable populations
- Utilize emPOWER program data to identify medically dependent on power, assure power and perform wellness checks
- Educate staff on personal preparedness
- Prepare facility for keeping staff overnight: sleeping accommodations, personal hygiene supplies, etc.
- Consider transportation options to bring staff into work
