PROGRAMMATIC UPDATES

Current Projects:

- Wrapping up deliverables for the year; grant cycle ends June 30, 2024
- Facilitating discussions on CHEMPACK planning at the local level
- Preparing for the next five-year Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP) grant cycle that starts July 1, 2024; instead of addressing four capabilities as the last cycle did, the new grant period will require work on the following proposed eight capabilities:
 - Incident management and coordination
 - Patient movement
 - Workforce
 - Resources

- Operational continuity
- Information management
- Specialty care
- Community Integration
- The National Prehospital Pediatric Readiness Project has launched. Emergency Medical Services (EMS) agencies are asked to participate in the Prehospital Pediatric Readiness Project (PPRP) and complete a pediatric readiness assessment by visiting EMSPedsReady.org. After completing the assessment, you will receive an individualized report to identify where your agency can improve its pediatric care.
 - The North Central Regional Trauma Advisory Council (NCRTAC) is incentivizing services in our region to participate by offering grants of \$250 to four services drawn at random from the list of agencies that complete the survey

Budgetary Updates:

- The 2023-2024 budget was revised to assure use of all available funds; unspent funds were shifted to allow for the purchase of:
 - An updated OWL and accessories to improve audio visuals during hybrid meetings
 - First Line dry decontamination products to provide to ambulance services in our region
 - Purpose Statement: The intention of the HERC is to revitalize our decontamination capability within the region utilizing new technology with the First Line dry decontamination program. Our initial goal is to provide supplies to EMS located in areas with the least amount of regional resources. Going forward we intend to enhance this program. We recognize this is a multi-year project. Our intention is to provide training along with the initial supplies. It is our expectation that we will provide the initial supplies and training, however we expect the services to receive the training and replace used or expired products.
 - 100 personal decontamination kits, to include four dry decontamination wipes and a small bottle of Dahlgren decontamination solution, were purchased to be placed on 100 ambulances in the region; for a quick 3-minute video on these innovative products click <u>here</u>
- Preparations on the 2024-2025 budget are underway

Upcoming/Recent Exercises:

- The Medical Response Emergency Surge Exercise (MRSE) is complete; the AAR is here
- CMS Exercise was held June 12, 2024 and addressed an active shooter threat; the AAR will soon be coming

Regional Updates:

- Hospitals need to report any exercise or real-life incident in the MATCH survey
- MGT 403: Underserved Populations Preparedness Planning for Rural Responders and Volunteers will be offered in Wausau in August, see flyer for more details and registration
- As follow-up to recent exercises, the HERC should be notified should the following activation triggers occur:
 - An event where resource needs will exceed the responding facility's capacity
 - An event that overwhelms resources
 - Number of expected patients from an incident exceed normal response
 - o Healthcare facility's ability to care for patients has been compromised
 - Multi-jurisdictional infectious disease event
