Current Projects:

- Completed the 2024-2025 regional Hazard Vulnerability Assessment (HVA) [report](#)
- Continue to update and enhance plans per ASPR and state guidance
- Completed the required Readiness Assessment Plan, which is essentially the HERC's five-year workplan guiding the assessments, plan development, and training/exercise schedule
- Participating on the North Central RTAC Trauma conference planning committee and developing the preparedness track for the conference that will take place at North Central Technical College on April 10; register [here](#)
- Working with partners to educate and problem solve concerns surrounding EMResource drills
- Continue to provide WISCOM radio technical assistance and run drills with hospital partners twice monthly
- Distributed over 50 dry decontamination kits to regional ambulance services; there are still some kits available, contact herc.coordinator@ncw-herc.org if you are interested

Budgetary Updates:

- 2023-2024 audit is complete – no major concerns were found
- Bidding on audit quotes for this upcoming year has begun
- Awaiting to hear of potential H5N1 funding coming this spring/summer

Upcoming/Recent Exercises:

- Planning is underway for this year's Medical Response Surge Exercise (MRSE);
 - This is a required patient surge exercise; however, this year there will be exercise play around opening of a Family Assistance Center, risk communications, and patient tracking so that other partners can participate and test their plans as well
 - Exercise will be held May 6 from 9:00 – 12:00; this will be hosted virtually; however, hospitals and local partners will want to open their own ICP/EOC to work through the injects
